
NONPROFIT GRANT PROGRAMS

The Putnam County Community Foundation depends upon the work of effective mission-driven nonprofits that make a positive impact in our community.

Community Grants are awarded on a competitive basis. The Community Foundation has awarded \$3 million through the Community Grants program. Applications and important dates are available on our website.

Capacity Building Grants assist nonprofits with up to 50% of the cost of a consultant to assist with long-range planning, staff and board training, communications, and marketing. Applications are accepted year-round and are available on our website.

The Nonprofit Learning Series are high-quality, convenient, inexpensive workshops and networking opportunities to develop the knowledge and skills of current and future leaders of charitable organizations. Workshops and registration forms are available on our website.

Grant Station is a grant search software offered at the Community Foundation office free of charge to Putnam County nonprofits. Call to schedule an appointment.

SERVICES FOR PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS

Share the Dream is a program to build your endowment, engage in friendly competition, and win grants for your organization. Nonprofits receive publicity, education and support for their fundraising planning and efforts, recognition for their donors, and grant support if they raise the most money.



Endowment Builder Grants offer a matching grant to help nonprofits build their endowments at the Community Foundation. Information and applications are available on our website.

Direct Deposit can be arranged for a nonprofit's donors by ACH for monthly, quarterly, or annual deposit to your Putnam County Community Foundation endowment.

Planned Giving Partnership Services are available to charitable organizations interested in working with donors to establish planned gifts for the benefit of the organization.

The Community Foundation works with participating organization and provides a variety of resources including consultation, training, access to planned giving software, marketing materials and marketing support.

Charitable Gift Annuity Administration is offered by the Community Foundation for charitable organization endowments. Charitable gift annuities pay income to your donors for life and help insure the future of your nonprofit organization.

The Gifts of Grain Program makes it easy for your donors to make gifts of grain to benefit your charity's endowment.

Marketing and Publicity of charitable organization endowments is provided to current and potential donors on a continual basis via the website, newsletters, annual report, weekly Tribute Ads in the *Banner Graphic*, press releases, and other activities.

What is an Endowment?

The donation of money or property for the ongoing support of a nonprofit organization, protecting the principle and using the earnings to benefit the organization.

Why establish an Endowment?

A nonprofit's endowment generates a reliable source of unrestricted annual income for the charitable organization to utilize in perpetuity and is an important part of a nonprofit's diversified funding stream.

Who will contribute to my Endowment?

An endowment provides a single place to which many donors may contribute at any time to build permanent support for the nonprofit.

How will the Endowment work?

The Community Foundation administers the fund, including gift processing, accounting, investing, reporting, and donor acknowledgments for a maximum annual fee of 1% of the market value of the fund.
